1 ANIMATED OPENING

The Columbia Statue comes to life and skates out of frame. The setting sun animates into a spinning ball.

MATCH CUT WITH:

2 EXT. - VENICE BEACH - SUNSET

of a red roller skate wheel spinning. The title music pops in. The camera tracks back quickly to reveal the skater, Pistol Pete, and the Venice boardwalk. Pistol Pete is already at top speed precariously shooting in, out, and between pedestrians, bicycles, and trash cans that pack the boardwalk. He playfully swipes food and drinks, sunglasses from the pedestrians as they walk past.

3 EXT. - VENICE BEACH - ANOTHER ANGLE

Stan, Richie, and Susan skate down the boardwalk. They joke with each other. Richie is checking out the girls. Stan and Susan do a stunt.

4 EXT. - VENICE BEACH - ANGLE ON SKATERS - SEVERAL ANGLES

We see different people skating: A woman in Beverly Hills gets out of her limo dressed in fur and and evening gown and skates into Gucci's. A business man skates through a crowded street, briefcase in hand. A high school girl carries her books from the school entrance and skates past the camera. A boy in a cast. His cost leg has a skate on it. A woman hitchhiking. She is thumbing a ride. A guy picks her up. She holds on to his waist and they skate off. A nurse wheeling a baby carriage. The nurse is on skates.

5 EXT. - VENICE AREA - ANGLE ON GANG

A touch street gang rides through the streets. They terrorize pedestrians and motorists alike. The twenty member gang is like a flying squadron, peeling off, and banking to the sides at the signal of its leader.

6 ANGLE ON STAN, RICHIE, SUSAN (INTERCUT WITH PISTOL PETE)

Stan, Richie, and Susan roll down the Venice boardwalk. Pistol Pete is coming the opposite direction. As he passes them, he swipes Stan's metallic sunglasses. AS Pistol Pete skates away. Richie, Stan, and Susan skate in the opposite

direction. The camera tilts up to the sky for titles. We see super-imposed roller skaters in the sky. Credits spin out from their wheels. The credits end. The sky fades to black. The title music fades with the picture.

7 EXT. - SKATE TOWN - NIGHT

The camera tilts down from the sky to reveal Skate Town U.S.A. A glittering neon sign shines over the entrance to Skate Town. The building is situated on the Santa Monica Pier. The owner, Harvey, and his son, Jimmy (Billy Barty) walk into the entrance. Jimmy carries a large box that covers his face.

8 INT. - CAROUSEL - NIGHT

Harvey and Jimmy walk around an old carousel. They disappear into a blinding flash of light.

9 INT. - LOBBY - TICKET BOOTH

Harvey and Jimmy walk through the lobby and past the ticket booth. Teri, the cashier, sits in the ticket booth. Harvey and Jimmy walk past the skate rental booth to the side and say hello to Samantha. Just then, the DJ, Boppin' Bobby Blue, skates past them and disappears through another flash of light.

10 INT. - RINK - NIGHT

The rink is dimly lit. Bobby Blue skates down a ramp. As he does, lights flash on the ramp as if trailing after him. He skates to his DJ booth that is suspended above the rink. He climbs up a pole into the booth.

11 INT. - DJ BOOTH - NIGHT

Bobby blue puts the arm of the stereo down on the first record of the evening. The music begins.

BOBBY BLUE Time to wake up Skate Town. He throws a switch.

12 SERIES OF SHOTS - LIGHTS

Banks of disco lights illuminate. They pop on to the beat of the music. The snack bar lights come on revealing the

attendants; Ripple and Ben.

NOTE: Ben and Ripple are improvisational characters. While we indicate where their routines go, we have done no more than that. It is anticipated that Gary Muldeer will play the role of Ben and Gallager, the role of Ripple.

The bandstand lights go on revealing the Skate Town logo.

13 INT. - - HARVEY

scooting toward the office. To avoid the music, he grabs a paper napkin, tears pieces off of it, and stuffs them into his ears as plugs. He rushes into his office for relief.

14 INT. - DJ BOOTH - ANGLE ON BOBBY BLUE

He speaks into a microphone.

BOBBY BLUE

Welcome, bonjour, bienvenido, ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls, disco skating Homo sapiens of all colors, creeds and sexual orientations: This is Boppin' Bobby Blue, saying how do you do?

15 EXT. - SKATE TOWN - NIGHT

The sign above Skate Town illuminates. Lights come on outlining the entire building. Skaters rush toward the entrance.

BOBBY BLUE (V.O.) Tonight's the big night. The finals of the Disco Roller Skating Contest. Plus, exciting roller exhibitions and stunts, plus the fabulous Beach Boys.

16 INT. - TICKET BOOTH

People skate up to the ticket booth, rent skates. The area is packed. Bobby Blue continues to rap.

16

17 INT. - RINK - NIGHT

Roller skaters scoot down the winding ramp to the rink floor and proceed to circle the rink.

18 INT. - DJ BOOTH

Bobby Blue talks to the camera.

BOBBY BLUE It's time to start our fantasy, now that you've come in. Here's a handful of stardust ---

He picks up a handful of colored confetti.

BOBBY BLUE (cont'd) -- let the magic begin. He throws it down over the rink.

- 19 INT. CONTESTANT'S TABLE ANGLE ON RICHIE, STAN, SUSAN 1 Confetti falls on top of their heads.
- 20 INT. LOUNGE AREA

The camera pans with an out-of-control male skater as he tries to regain his balance on the rink floor. He scoots through an opening along the railing, past occupied tables and smack into the Coke machine. The Coke machine spews Coke and change on the guy as the Skate Patrol rescues him. Just then, Stan and Richie walk into the frame. The camera dollies with them past the accident and up to the contestant's table. Stan is our hero, a good-looking typical Southern California eighteen year old. His good fried Richie is a parody of John Travolta. Richie is very excited.

> RICHIE I think I fell in love.

STAN We just walked into the place, Richie.

RICHIE I don't care. I'm in love with that half of the rink. Would you look at that girl? 4

21 INT. - RINK

He is looking at one of the Hookers. Stan, however, is looking at Pistol Pete doing an intricate routine.

22 BACK TO SCENE

STAN Never mind her, look at him. That guy's fantastic. I told you we shouldn't have come.

RICHIE

Don't be silly.

Stan starts to back away from the contestant's table. Richie puts his hand on Stan's shoulder.

RICHIE (cont'd) Where are you going? Stan, you're good. You're the best. I've seen 'em come and go and I know you're the best. But you'll never know it unless you try.

Stan is weakening.

RICHIE (cont'd) Besides, if you don't win -- you'll be letting me down.

STAN Letting you down?

RICHIE

Yeah. 'Cause when you win this competition, as your manager, the girls will have to go through me --(rubbing his hands gleefully) -- and vice versa.

Stan signs in.

STAN

Well, don't get your hopes up, pal. I do all right in the Valley, but this is Skate Town U.S.A. These guys are pros.

CONTINUED: (2) They start to walk toward the dressing rooms. RICHIE You will be, too. Because with your moves, my brains, and this ---He holds up a box. RICHIE (cont'd) -- You're going to be the skating champ of Los Angeles. They enter the men's dressing room. Stan looks at the box curiously. CUT TO: 23 INT. - DJ BOOTH - ANGLE ON BOBBY BLUE He talks into the mic. BOBBY BLUE Skate your eyes over to the right of the bandstand for the first ---ANGLE ON RINK 24 A group of performers skate out to a special area near the bandstand. BOBBY BLUE (V.O.) -- Disco roller skating exhibition of the evening. Ladies and gentlemen, the _____ 25 ANGLE ON GROUP They do part of a routine. 26 EXT. - HARVEY'S OFFICE - NIGHT Harvey walks out of his office with the Disco Doctor, who is dressed in white with a doctor's bag. Harvey winces at the disco music as he walks out. The group routine continues in the background. NOTE: The Disco Doctor is an improvise character who will be played by Bill Kirkenbower.

(CONTINUED)

DOCTOR I sure do appreciate this, Mr. Ross.

HARVEY

Well, I'm an old Army man myself. Combat veteran. World War II. Stationed in Northern Alaska. Held the record, you know: machinegunned eight walruses in one day.

DOCTOR

Fantastic! You know what I was during the war?

HARVEY

A traitor?

DOCTOR

No, I'm a S.W.C.T. vet -- Simulated War Condition Training. But it was very realistic. Real simulated bombs, barbed wire ---

He starts to lose control

DOCTOR (cont'd) -- The Green Team captured me at the lunch counter of a Denny's restaurant. They tried to break me with a simulated prisoner torture technique, but I fooled them. I pretended I couldn't see or hear

He is now completely out of control.

DOCTOR (cont'd) -- That drove them crazy. But I'm OK now. Every thing's cool. I'm really together.

HARVEY

Yes, you seem very together. I must remember to call you next time I want brain surgery. Harvey shakes his head. He wonders what he is in for.

HARVEY (cont'd) (to himself) Oh, headache.

JIMMY He has a headache.

They walk past the snack stand.

CUT TO:

27 EXT. - SNACK STAND

A drug dealer sneaks through the crowd with an overcoat full of drugs. He is spotted by the rent-a-cop (Joe E. Ross).

ROSS

Ooooh, ooooh.

The dealer dumps his stash dangerously near the root beer syrup in the snack bar, and runs away.

28 INT. - RINK - SKATING GROUP

They finish their routine, and the crowd applauds.

29 INT. - DJ BOOTH

BOBBY BLUE

Let's skate!

30 EXT. - DJ BOOTH

Bobby Blue slides down the ramp into a golf cart and drives around the rink. He pulls up to Harvey and Jimmy. He motions to Harvey.

> BOBBY BLUE Hop in. I got the merchandise.

He gives Harvey a conspiratorial wink. Harvey climbs in, and Bobby Blue lurches off, nearly spilling Harvey, who scrambles to hang on.

CUT TO:

28

27

29

31 INT. - HARVEY'S OFFICE

Bobby Blue is clipping a small beeper device onto Harvey's belt. It's the small kind about the size of a cigarette package that doctors and businessmen use. The beeper goes off to let them know they should call their office.

HARVEY

So, what do I do, Bobby? I'm not very mechanical. I once hired a handyman to open a window for me.

BOBBY BLUE You just switch this left for on and right for off.

Bobby demonstrates.

HARVEY

I see. And when it beeps, that means my wife is in the area, and I can tell if she's approaching.

BOBBY BLUE

That's right. The beeps will get faster and louder as she gets closer. You planted that transmitter on her, didn't you?

HARVEY

Yes, I did. I put it in her ring. I was going to put it in her I.U.D., but I forgot where it is.

BOBBY BLUE Why are you doing all this?

HARVEY

I'm in the middle of a divorce, Bobby, which you're well aware of. When my wife sees me, I want to look poor; down and out. I want her to think the only thing she'll get custody of is my food stamps.

Richie skates out.

STAN (O.S.) I'm not coming out. I feel ridiculous.

Richie skates back in. He leads Stan out. Stan is wearing a white suit with fringe and over the eyes is a white mask. Susan is with them.

STAN This is real stupid.

They skate out onto the rink.

RICHIE

It's not stupid. You're playing a role. Everybody plays a role in here. It's part of the fun. Look at that guy, there.

33 ANGLE ON PISTOL PETE - STAN'S POV

He is a short black man dressed in a Mexican bandit costume. He does a variation of a Mexican hat dance on skates.

> RICHIE (V.O.) And how about that guy?

34 ANGLE ON FRED ASTAIRE CHARACTER

A guy in black tails, top hat, and cane practices a tap dance on skates.

35 BACK TO SCENE

They look at people.

RICHIE Pizzaz. Showmanship. That's what wins contests -- believe me.

STAN But I'm just a street skater. 32

RICHIE No! You were just a street skater. Now you're the man in the white suit -- the Lone Ranger -- every woman's dream -- the hero.

STAN

I'm no hero ---

Boppin' Bobby Blue comes by in a golf cart. Rapping about dreams and fantasy. He hits Stan with some colored confetti on the word "hero." Stan brushes the confetti off his hair.

> STAN (cont'd) I'm Stan Nelson from the Valley.

> > RICHIE

You know that, and I know that, but they don't know that. Don't you see? You're whatever you want to be in here. This isn't real. This is a fantasy. An illusion. A mirage.

They skate off the rink floor and settle down at a table.

36 CLOSE ON STAN

as he looks out at the rink.

STAN Looks like a roller rink with disco lights to me.

Stan notices something on the rink floor. He stares out at whatever it is as Richie continues to speak.

RICHIE (O.S.) Ah, Stan. You're impossible. But you'll see. Stay in this place a few minutes and it'll start to rub off on you.

37 INT. - RINK - ANGLE ON ALLISON - STAN'S POV

A lovely, young girl of sixteen glides in the middle of the rink gracefully as the disco skaters circle frantically around her. She is a vision in her simple white dress. She almost seems to glow.

38 BACK TO STAN

Richie's words are almost inaudible as Stan tries to shake his head clear of the vision.

> RICHIE (O.S.) (fading out) You'll see. You'll see. It's not like out there in the real world ---

He looks back out toward the rink.

39 ANGLE ON ALLISON - STAN'S POV (INTERCUT WITH STAN AS NEEDED) 39

Almost subliminally, the fast driving disco music is overpowered by a simple love song. The disco lighting fades out, magically, and softer romantic lighting filters in. The disco skates seem to fade out with the lights continuing their dancing as they melt into the darkness. Now only Allison can be seen as she skates in the middle of the rink. The routine is both intricate and simple, and Allison is grace personified. As she finishes she looks up in Stan's direction. Her face is angelic.

40 CLOSE ON STAN

He is awed by her beauty. He smiles at her.

41 BACK TO ALLISON

She smiles back.

42 CLOSE ON STAN

He is utterly charmed.

The hard disco music pops back in as Richie puts his hand in front of Stan's face and waves it to get his attention. Stan looks over at Richie. 12

RICHIE Lost you there for a second, pal.

STAN (dreamily) She smiled at me.

RICHIE No girls tonight. You're in training.

Stan looks back at the rink.

RICHIE (cont'd) Now that we got the costume down, we got to work on psyching you up for this thing. It's all mental attitude.

43 INT. - RINK - STAN'S POV

Allison is not where she was. The camera pans and we see a glimpse of her glowing white dress as she disappears into the crowd.

44 BACK TO STAN AND RICHIE

Stan gets up and skates away after Allison. Richie doesn't notice as he makes some marks in a note pad.

RICHIE First we got to think 'win.' All the great athletes in the world think 'win.' And you ---

He turns to Stan and sees that he isn't there.

RICHIE (cont'd)

Stan?

He looks under the table.

Stan skates through the crowd after Allison. He gets tangled in the Hookers who are taking Joe Ross, the rent-a-cop, to their pleasure van outside. 44

STAN (to Joe) Have you seen a girl in a white dress ---(embarrassed) -- oh, never mind.

He's lost sight of her completely.

46 ANGLE ON THE DISCO DOCTOR AND A GIRL

The Disco Doctor is examining the knee of a beautiful girl. He takes out his stethoscope and places it on her chest.

> DOCTOR Now, take a deep breath.

The girl does so. Her breasts rise on the inhale and fall back on the exhale. The Doctor is enjoying the examination. Stan skates through the scene.

> DOCTOR (cont'd) Again! Keep doing it!

47 INT. - SNACK STAND

Stan skates up to the counter. There is no sign of Allison. The stools are full of people drinking. Ben accidentally pushes the drugs into the root beer syrup.

NOTE: Ben is screwing up the orders for food, burning hot dogs, etc.

The scene is reminiscent of hundreds of bar room scenes in western movies. Ben, the bartender, cleans a glass and takes orders for root beers. Stan leans on the counter and summons Ben. Ben slides root beers down the bar counter to customers. An assortment of strangely clad customers order the drinks.

STAN

Bartender.

Ben turns around. Stan motions to him to come over.

STAN Did you see a pretty girl in a glowing white dress pass the bar?

BEN Can't say that I have, pal.

INDIAN (O.S.)

I saw her.

Stan turns around.

48 INT. - SNACK STAND - ANGLE ON INDIAN AND STAN

48

A white guy in an Indian head dress stands in the corner of the snack bar area.

INDIAN She went that way. He points toward the exit.

Stan smiles.

STAN

Thanks.

He takes off after her. He skates toward the exit, skating past skaters.

49 ANGLE ON SKATERS

They begin a choreographed number dressed in street clothes.

50 ANGLE ON BOBBY BLUE

He races past them in a golf cart, sprinkling them with confetti.

51 SKATERS

are magically transformed into white tails, top hats, and canes.

BOBBY BLUE (V.O.) Ladies and gentlemen, the fabulous

The skaters do a group routine.

52 ANGLE ON HARVEY

Harvey and Jimmy and two people we haven't introduced watch the skaters. Irwin and Eleanor are typical repressed newlyweds. Harvey holds his fingers in his ears and winces at the sound.

NOTE: Irwin and Eleanor are improvise characters.

HARVEY

(to Jimmy)
They should use this music to make
spies talk.
 (to Irwin and Eleanor)
So, you're the couple who won the
night out at Skate Town.
Congratulations.

IRWIN

Yes. The winning question was 'Would you describe your first kiss as A) a kiss of bliss, B) a tongue in the lung, or C) A sticky hickey?'

ELEANOR

And we both answered 'none of the above.'

HARVEY

My first kiss was a mannequin in Macy's window. Boy, was I lonely.

They walk into the office.

53 INT. - HARVEY'S OFFICE - NIGHT

Harvey walks in. The place is a madhouse of delivery men, fast food, etc. Elliot, the band's manager, has taken over Harvey's office. He is busy on the phones, checking things off on a list as he talks. He is on six lines at the same time.

NOTE: Elliot is an improvise character.

Harvey closes the door, closing out the music.

ELLIOT (into phone) Well? Yes, I said three llamas. Uh huh. One female, two males. Not the other way around.

Elliot hits a button on the phone to change lines.

ELLIOT What's with the cases of soft drinks? I didn't mean that kind of coke, stupid.

Elliot hits another button. He covers the mouthpiece of the phone and addresses Harvey.

ELLIOT (cont'd) Put it down over there.

Elliot indicates a spot across the room. Harvey is confused. Irwin and Eleanor are freaked out. As delivery men come in and out of the room, the music cuts in and out with the opening of the door.

HARVEY

(to Jimmy) What's going on here? Who is the guy ordering take-out llamas on my phone?

JIMMY That's Elliot. The Beach Boys' manager. He needed to make some calls.

HARVEY Headache. I need an aspirin enema. (to Irwin) Oh, just a minute. I'll get your tickets.

IRWIN It's really fun being a newlywed.

HARVEY We have an oyster vending machine if are low on lead. Harvey turns and stumbles over a box. It breaks open. Maps strew out on the floor, along with some little books. Harvey goes over and looks through them. He picks some up and reads them.

> HARVEY (cont'd) A map of the stars in Wichita, Kansas?

He reads another.

HARVEY (cont'd) A handicapped sex manual?

And another.

HARVEY (cont'd) The Boat People Cook Book?

Harvey looks up at Elliot.

HARVEY (cont'd) These people are weird.

Harvey looks at another tiny book.

HARVEY (cont'd) This is certainly a tiny book. 'A Directory of Eskimo Cliff Divers.'

Harvey tip-toes through the room as Elliot continues. Delivery men bring in box after box of who-knows-what.

> ELLIOT (into phone) Wait a second. (to delivery men) Guys? That goes to the bus out in the lot.

DELIVERY MAN It says here 'Skate Town U.S.A.' This is Skate Town U.S.A.

ELLIOT Yes, I know, but --- (phone rings) Yeah? No. That was a wah-wah pedal, two yo-yos, and a blonde.

Harvey hands Irwin and Eleanor their tickets.

HARVEY

Now. You can go pick up your skates, and you also get a complimentary Mr. Goodbar.

54 EXT. - HARVEY'S OFFICE - IRWIN AND ELEANOR

They walk along watching the people on the rink. An out-ofcontrol skater passes by them. He crashes into the Coke machine.

ELEANOR This looks dangerous. Maybe we should go home.

IRWIN

Don't worry, dear. We'll have fun.

Bobby Blue drives by in the golf cart showering them with confetti on the word "fun."

55 EXT. - SKATE TOWN - PARKING LOT

Stan is looking for Allison. There are a lot of distractions: People skate around practicing routines. Stan spots a double-decker band bus with strange sounds emanating from it. NOTE: The bus belongs to the Beach Boys. We will cut to it several times. Each time the noises and articles thrown out the windows become more outlandish.

56 ANGLE ON STAN

He looks at the bus. Just then a woman's voice interrupts.

HOOKER (O.S.) Hey, cowboy.

Stan turns around expectantly. When he sees who it is, though, his smile fades.

(CONTINUED)

HOOKER Looking for some action?

STAN Ah, not tonight, thank you.

HOOKER

Too bad.

She gives him the once over and leaves. Stan looks around for Allison. Just then, Richie and Susan skate up. He is fascinated and distracted by the hookers.

> RICHIE Stan! Where have you been? Where'd you go?

\mathtt{STAN}

(confused)
I don't know. I saw this person -at least I think I saw this person
-- and then she disappeared and -Boy! Are you right about this
place!

Richie is drooling watching the hookers take the newest john (the Dealer) into their pleasure van.

RICHIE

I told you so, pal. Look at those ladies.

STAN I got to find her.

He skates back toward the entrance. Richie reluctantly follows.

CUT TO:

57

57 INT. - SKATE TOWN - ENTRANCE

They skate down the ramp and onto the rink. Just then, they hear a voice.

PISTOL PETE

Gringo!

Stan and Richie turn around and spot a black man in a Mexican bandit costume. A strap of bullets criss-crosses his chest and he wears a large sombrero. A Caucasian pal to his side wears the same get-up.

> STAN Is he calling me?

> > RICHIE

Yeah.

PISTOL PETE Gringo! Get over here.

RICHIE

It's the old psyche-out routine. It's part of the ritual. Come on. It's fun.

58 ANGLE ON TABLE

Pete and his sidekick sit at a table overlooking the rink. Stan, Richie, and Susan skate up.

> PISTOL PETE Buenos noches, gringos. (to Stan) I haven't seen you on this side of the border, amigo.

Stan looks at Richie for advice. Richie speaks up.

RICHIE We're from the north. Just got into Skate Town today.

PISTOL PETE My name is Pedro Bandilito Roosevelt Smith. Pistol Pete, for short.

RICHIE My name's Richie. This is my boy, Stan.

PISTOL PETE Your boy can't talk, is that it?

STAN

I can talk.

RICHIE He talks with his skates.

PISTOL PETE Bueno! Bueno! (looks at skates) Are you good with those skates?

STAN

Not bad.

RICHIE He's the best!

PISTOL PETE The best, huh? (snapping his fingers) Pepe! Clippings!

Pepe hands Pete a book of clippings. Pete opens the book.

59 CLOSE ON BOOK

He turns the pages. Pete is seen skating. The headlines read that he is victorious in different contests.

PISTOL PETE (V.O.) Take a look, gringos. Look at my clippings.

60 ANGLE ON ALL

Pete pages through the book.

PISTOL PETE Championships from one border to the other.

RICHIE You can't skate on newspaper clippings, Pete. 59

STAN (whispering) Good one, Richie. (aloud) Yeah. Bring your book after the contest is over and I'll autograph it for you.

Pete smiles.

PISTOL PETE We'll see, gringo. Hasta luego.

STAN Buenos noches, señor.

Stan and Richie skate away.

RICHIE That was great, Stan. Now you're getting at the idea.

Stan is pretty proud of himself. He and Richie skate away to reveal:

CUT TO:

61 ANGLE ON DISCO DOCTOR AND VOLUPTUOUS GIRL

He still has a stethoscope on her chest.

BLONDE Are you sure this is the right examination for a scraped knee?

DOCTOR I'll tell you, my dear. It isn't if you're not thorough. Now to the knee.

He lifts up her dress delicately revealing a curvaceous leg. The knee is ever so slightly damaged. He looks at the knee lasciviously.

> DOCTOR (cont'd) You know, the knee is a funny thing. Ha! Ha! It's usually connected to --

(carried away) -- a real groovy calf on one side and an out-of-sight thigh on the other.

BLONDE Do you think it's serious?

DOCTOR (not listening) I'd love to.

Just then, a strobing bank of lights crosses the railing right in front of the Disco Doctor. Something happens to him, he jumps up in fright, turns around and bumps into a man carrying a tray of food. The Disco Doctor turns around quickly revealing his shirt spattered with ketchup. He looks down at the "blood" in panic. He's flipped.

> DOCTOR Murphy! They got me! Get out of Denny's, quick! Save yourself!

He jumps over the railing and pops back up pretending to fire a make-believe machine gun.

DOCTOR (cont'd) Charlie's in the tree! Two can play at that game, sucker!

He crawls under the tables and out of sight.

CUT TO:

62 INT. - GIRLS' BATHROOM - NIGHT

Very shyly, Eleanor sits down on a bench lacing up her skates. In the background, girls are applying make-up in front of the mirrors. She is quite uneasy as she watches the girls. One of the girls stuffs Kleenex into her bra to add to her bust line. Another pops some pills and offers Eleanor some. She giggles.

63 INT. - MENS' ROOM

The mens' dressing area is packed. Everybody in there is smoking a joint -- everybody. There is a brown cloud hovering in the room. The camera dollies through the maze of 63

CONTINUED: (2)

people right up to Irwin, who is lacing up his skates. He coughs. Joints are continually thrust into his face. He constantly says, "No thank you," and smiles. He turns and goes to put his shoes in a locker. He opens the first one. An enema bag dangles out of the locker. He closes the first and moves on to the second locker. The next locker reveals a stash of whips, chains, and other instruments of torture. Irwin is confused. The next locker is dark and seemingly empty. He goes to put his shoes in the locker and someone from within yells:

VOICE

Close that door!

Irwin slams it shut.

64 EXT. - LOUNGE AREA - NIGHT

Irwin and Eleanor meet at the rink entrance. People skate past them at high speeds. Eleanor has visibly stuffed her bra with tissue paper. They are having enough problems standing up on the skates let alone getting onto the rink. Just then, a huge black hulk of a man skates up to Eleanor.

HULK

(ominously) Could I have this dance, please?

Eleanor looks at Irwin. Irwin looks at Eleanor.

ELEANOR Well -- ah -- you see -- ah ---

IRWIN (nervously) The fact is ---

The Hulk turns to Irwin.

HULK (menacingly)

Yes?

Irwin is definitely intimidated.

IRWIN The fact is one little dance couldn't hurt.

He smiles up at the man.

IRWIN (cont'd) (nudging Eleanor with his elbow) Go ahead, dear.

Eleanor timidly takes the man's hand and goes out ot the rink floor. Irwin smiles as if to say it's all right. They skate away. Irwin looks after them.

65 INT. - RINK - IRWIN'S P.O.V.

He spots them as they come around the rink. Eleanor is wrapped around the man's left log, holding on for dear life. They wave at each other as she passes. Just then, Irwin is pulled down to the floor.

66 ANGLE ON FLOOR - IRWIN AND THE DISCO DOCTOR

The Disco Doctor has pulled Irwin under a table. He shushes him.

DOCTOR

Quiet!

He cups his hands over Irwin's mouth.

DOCTOR (cont'd) Charlie's up in the trees. They're shooting real simulated bullets out there. Listen, Murphy! You're my only hope. Get back to camp. Tell them I'm wounded. Got it?

He removes his hand from the stunned Irwin's mouth.

IRWIN (afraid) My name isn't Murphy.

DOCTOR Ha! Ha! The old name, rank, and serial number bit, huh? Good ol' Murphy. Now get going!

Irwin starts to crawl back out. The Disco Doctor grabs him again. Irwin looks at him, fearfully.

DOCTOR (cont'd) The camp's that way, Murph! Quick. I'm simulated bleeding all over the place.

Irwin crawls between the tables.

DOCTOR (cont'd) Keep your ass down! Quick! Quick!

Irwin crawls quickly. Just then the DJ sprinkles confetti on the Doctor as he flies past in his cart. He immediately goes back to his Doctor character. He turns to the knee next to him as if nothing had happened.

> DOCTOR (cont'd) Yes, knees are a funny thing. Ha! Ha!

The body above screams. The knee belongs to Elvira, an elderly woman standing with two other people.

NOTE: These are the Stuffy People (Elvira, her husband, and her girlfriend), and are improvise characters. She wacks him with her purse and turns to her husband.

ELVIRA

Do you see Murray! That's the reason we're going to close this place down!

CUT TO:

67

67 ANGLE ON STAN, RICHIE, AND SUSAN - IN RINK

Stan and Susan limber up on the railing, stretching their legs. Richie paces back and forth and counts out.

RICHIE One and two and one and two ---

STAN That's enough.

nat's enough.

RICHIE Push yourselves and one and two ---

STAN

Ouch!

RICHIE If you want to be the champs you gotta push. Go that extra mile.

Just then:

BOBBY BLUE (O.S.) And now, ladies and gentlemen, a special surprise: three-time world champion rhythm roller skater, the fabulous, the incomparable, the one and only ... Maurice Cook!

Stan, Richie, and Susan look out to the middle of the rink.

68 INT. - RINK

The other skaters spread out as Maurice Cook skates into the middle of the rink. (Maurice's routine) His routine use a basketball, boxing moves, karate, and disco dancing. He is class.

69 ANGLE ON STAN (INTERCUT WITH ROUTINE)

He is fascinated. Maurice is the best.

70 BACK TO ROUTINE

Maurice's routine ends. There is thunderous applause.

BOBBY BLUE (O.S.) The fabulous Maurice Cook. Let's hear it for him.

Maurice skates around the rink to the applause of the other skaters. He passes Stan and the others.

69

Stan is applauding enthusiastically. Richie and Susan are equally impressed.

STAN Now that's a real champ.

Richie throws a towel over Stan's shoulders.

STAN (cont'd) If I could be a tenth as good as Maurice I could win this contest.

RICHIE

Well you are, my boy. A tenth, possible a seventh. In any case, you're going to win. I can see it now. Girls lining up at your dressing room door. Trophies, TV contracts, glitter, and the glamor. We got the costume, the confidence, and the conditioning. Nothing can stop us now!

72 EXT. - SKATE TOWN - NIGHT

As if in response to Richie's words, a gang skates through the amusement area of the pier. They disrupt the games that are in progress. They skate down the pier toward Skate Town to a disco version of the Jet song from West Side Story.

73 EXT. - SKATE TOWN - ENTRANCE - NIGHT

They skate through the entrance.

74 INT. - MERRY-GO-ROUND

The gang skates around the merry-go-round and gets enveloped in a flash of light.

75 INT. - TICKET BOOTH

The gang skates past.

HARVEY Ace, wait! Pay! You didn't ---

The gang is out of earshot.

HARVEY (cont'd)

Pay.

(to himself)
I'll let you rape my grandmother.

Harvey sits down in the booth. It's no use.

HARVEY

Headache.

76 INT. - RINK - THE GANG

Skates down the ramp to the rink floor. They begin racing around the circumference of the rink. They bump people out of the way, trip some skaters, and drive everyone else off the rink. Once the gang has cleared the floor, they skate to the center of the rink.

77 ANGLE - THE GANG

Does its choreographed dance routine. It is a combination of macho moves and karate kicks and punches.

78 INTERCUT

The gang dancing and Harvey, in his office, watching them on his closed-circuit TV.

79 HARVEY'S OFFICE

Harvey is sitting at his desk, watching the TV, and shaking his head.

HARVEY (to himself) If God wanted us to do that we'd have been born with wheels instead of toes.

In the background, a pleasant Andre Kostelanitz-type music is playing. Harvey can't hear the disco music where he is. He can, however, hear his beeper, which suddenly sets up a racket. Harvey panics. He jumps up, goes to his closet, 30

takes off his fancy jacket, and puts on a burlap coat with holes in it and lining hanging down. He flips off the music. He strews some empty bottles of cheap wine around. The beeping is growing louder and more insistent. Harvey pitches his fresh flowers out the window, and replaces them with wilted, dead ones. He turns all of his wall photos against the wall. On their backs is another picture, glass cracked and ugly. Harvey brings out a shoe-shine chair, and sets it up in a prominent spot in the room. He then presses a button.

80 INSERT

A little gate opens up, uncovering a hole in the wall at floor level. A rat looks out.

81 HARVEY

sticks an unlit cigar butt in his mouth. He puts on a pair of glasses held together by string. By now, the beeping of the pager is nearly intolerable. Harvey looks around to see that everything is the way he wants it, then grabs for the beeper to shut it off. He fumbles with it briefly, then finds the switch. Looking around for a place to secret it, he decides upon the waste basket.

82 ANGLE - HARVEY AND THE OFFICE DOOR

as Harvey dives for the waste basket. As soon as he has hidden the beeper, Agnes barges right in. She is middleaged, with a battle-axe demeanor. She is carrying a suitcase. Harvey manages to look surprised that Agnes is there.

AGNES

Well, Harvey, I brought the rest of your belongings.

Harvey pretends to be rummaging through the waste basket.

AGNES (cont'd) What are you doing?

for a shoe shine?

HARVEY Oh, hello, Agnes. I was just looking for something to eat. Care

(CONTINUED)

Agnes walks across the office and tosses the suitcase on Harvey's desk.

AGNES If I'm not mistaken, I think I passed a hooker on my way in here.

HARVEY

She's probably saying the same thing about you to one of her friends.

Harvey straightens up and starts going through the belongings Agnes has returned. He holds up a watch; it's broken. A pipe rack; it's broken. A tie; it's burned. A bowling ball; it's cracked in half. He picks up a record sleeve, turns it opening down, and pieces of vinyl pour out. As Harvey peruses his precious things, Agnes rants at him.

AGNES

I'm going to get you in court, buster. I'm telling them about that night in Scranton with that dwarf cleaning lady. That's mental anguish, my friend. And the time you put the yogurt in my brassiere? Not funny.

HARVEY

And I'll tell them how for two years I never got a bill from the gardener or the TV repairman. Explain that. And what about when we visited your uncle and you spent all that time in the barn with the bulls?

Agnes turns and storms to the door.

AGNES

You're impossible. I'm glad you're doing so poorly here.

HARVEY

If you find any more of my belongings, try to keep Orson Welles from sitting on them. Agnes exits and slams the door. Harvey takes the cigar butt out of his mouth. He flips on his pleasant music, takes out a beautiful long expensive cigar, puts it in his mouth, and lights it with a fancy lighter that he pull out of the desk.

83 INT. - SKATE TOWN DANCE FLOOR

The gang's disco number ends and they roll off the floor.

84 ANGLE ON STAN AND RICHIE

They watch the gang as they skate past them. One gang member turns over some drinks on a table. The people at the table are doused with soda.

85 BACK TO STAN

STAN Wow! They're really into their fantasy, aren't they?

RICHIE

(worried)

Yeah.

They watch the gang skate away.

86 INT. - CONTESTANT TABLE - THE GANG

The gang skates up to the table. They are all tough-looking characters, even the girls with them. The leader, Ace, a real wise-guy, goes to the head of the line.

ACE Make way! Make way!

He grabs the contestant sign-up clipboard from little Jimmy. He clanks his helmet on the table to get the attention of the others in line.

> ACE (cont'd) Attention! Attention! My name is Ace, and I just happen to be the best skater in the city. (to Jimmy) Isn't that right, Jimmy, my boy?

He squeezes Jimmy tightly.

JIMMY Anything you say, Ace.

88 BACK TO SCENE

Ace takes the clipboard and stalks away. The gang follows.

ACE Let's see who we got here.

JIMMY Ace, we need that sign-up sheet for the contestants.

ACE There ain't going to be any more contestants. (looks at paper) Astaire; he's over the hill. Pistol Pete stinks.

They get to a table. Alphonse, one of the gang members, dusts off Ace's seat and puts a pillow on it. Ace sits down. The other gang members gather around. Jimmy stands by.

ACE He's a nothing. He's a nothing. He's a ... (staring at sheet) Who's this guy -- Stan Nelson? Huh?

JIMMY He's a new guy. I never seen him before, Ace.

Ace hands Jimmy the clipboard forcefully.

ACE Well, you go find Mr. Stan Nelson and tell him Ace and the boys would like to make his acquaintance.

89 INT. - DJ BOOTH

BOBBY BLUE

Don't forget the snack bar for tummy yummy food and drink.

ANGLE ON SNACK STAND

The hot dogs on the rotisserie are burnt. Ben sends Ripple out to Der Wienerschnitzel. The line of people waiting for root beer refills is getting longer. They stand in a stupor. Ben takes a sip of root beer and wipes his sweating brow.

90 INT. - RINK

Jimmy skates up to Richie, Susan, and Stan as they lean against the railing.

JIMMY Excuse me. Is your name Stan Nelson?

STAN That's right.

JIMMY

Well, I have a message for you. There's a group of guys over there who want to meet you. He points to Ace and the gang.

Ace and the gang smile innocently.

92 BACK TO STAN

Jimmy talks out of the side of his mouth while smiling at Ace.

JIMMY If I were you I'd find an excuse not to go.

STAN (to Richie) I get it. The old psyche-out routine. Come on Richie, Susan.

Stan skates away. Richie is a little apprehensive. He and Susan skate after Stan. Jimmy remains looking a little worried.

93 ANGLE ON THE GANG

They sit around the table. Stan skates up to them, Richie and Susan join him. Stan is really into his character.

> STAN Is someone looking for me?

> > ACE

Yeah, pretty boy. It is I, Ace. It's a distinct pleasure to have you here. Would you do me the honor of sitting at my table?

RICHIE

Gee, thanks Ace for the invitation, but we got some strategy we got to work out. You understand ---

ACE

Sit down!

Stan smiles and hops over the railing. Richie and Susan walk around and apprehensively sit next to him. Ace smiles, malevolently. 36

ACE (cont'd) Pretty boy, this is the gang. Gang, this is pretty boy.

STAN (to gang) Hello, gang.

The gang lets out one collective grunt.

STAN Gang, this is my manager, Richie. Richie, this is the gang.

Richie tries to say something but all that comes out is a nervous, voice-breaking sound.

STAN (cont'd) And this is my sister Susan.

Ace takes a couple of cigarettes out of a pack. Susan tries to act tough.

ACE Have a cig.

Stan takes it and starts to reach into his vest pocket for a match. As he does, the gang begins to lunge for him. Stan pulls out a lighter and shows the gang.

ACE (cont'd) Cool down, boys. Pretty boy here is only being mannerly.

Ace leans over to Stan. Stan lights the middle of Ace's cigarette, ruining it. Stan then lights his own cigarette and hands it to Ace.

STAN Here. Have mine. I don't smoke: bad for the lungs.

Ace smiles and takes the cigarette. The scene takes on the flavor of a old-time Western show-down.

ACE I like your style. You any good? STAN I get around. ACE So do I. STAN That's funny. I never heard of you. ACE (pissed) You ever heard of the Venice Vigilante? STAN Sure. Fast, good moves, the best on the coast. ACE (smiling) Used to be the best on the coast. They use to be the best. Now, I'm the best. Ace snaps his fingers. ACE Skates! Franky hands him a box. Ace shows Stan his skates. They are black leather, polished with silver studs on them.

> ACE (cont'd) Look at those, pretty boy. Handmade. Maybe you just better hang up your skates and go home.

> STAN So that's how it is? You want me out of town?

ACE Nicely put.

STAN What are you scared of, Ace? ACE Scared? STAN Yeah. You got the best skates, you say you're the best skater -- why play with a stacked deck? ACE I like the odds better. STAN You're holding all the aces, Ace. ACE I got the whole deck, pal. What you got without the bullshit? STAN You calling? ACE Why should I? STAN 'Cause maybe I got a better hand. This strikes a chord in Allison. She walks around to her seat submissively. Just then:

Everyone looks out over to the bandstand.

99 ANGLE ON BOBBY BLUE

BOBBY BLUE Let's have a big welcome for the Beach Boys!

100 INT. - BANDSTAND

The curtains part and the Beach Boys start to play a song. The song has something to do with love, preferably love at first sight, something to do with the moment that Stan and Allison are having.

101 INTERCUT - STAN, ALLISON, AND THE GANG

Stan and Allison look at each other. Allison is somewhat shy. Ace watches them angrily. Richie is wondering what is going on. The lyrics of the Beach Boys' song tell the story. Susan and Franky are also looking at each other dreamily. As the Beach Boys play the tune, Allison and Stan look at each other and imagine themselves dancing together.

The group finishes the song and there is a round of applause. Elliot, the band manager, applauds from the side of the stage.

Ace puts his arm around her.

ACE

You bet it was nothing.

Allison shrugs his arm off her shoulder.

ACE (cont'd) Don't worry, boys. I'm going to take care of this contest business once and for all.

105 INT. - SNACK STAND

Ace skates past the snack stand. There is a mad rush on root beer. Ben and Ripple are beside themselves with orders that are coming fast and furious.

CUSTOMER

Root beer!

RIPPLE Small, medium, or large?

CUSTOMER

All three.

106 INT. - HARVEY'S OFFICE - NIGHT

Elliot is on the phones. Three llamas stand among the boxes of food and other paraphernalia that Elliot has for the band.

> ELLIOT That's a liverwurst sandwich with banana on a hot dog bun. Hold the mayo. Right.

Elliot pushes another button.

ELLIOT (cont'd) Yeah, the llamas are the right sex, but they're not in the bus. Right. They do no good in the office here.

Just then, Harvey runs into the office. He gingerly walks around the llamas, examining them.

HARVEY Why are they so small? What are they, Shetland camels? (to llama) Are you paper-trained? You better be, or I'll make a parka out of you. (surveys the scene) Headache.

Harvey crosses to Elliot, interrupting one of his calls.

ELLIOT Yeah, what is it?

HARVEY I was wondering if I could use one of my phones?

Elliot rolls his eyes. He can't believe he is being asked to relinquish one of his phone lines.

ELLIOT How long you going to be?

HARVEY Thanks. I'll never forget this.

Harvey crosses to his desk and picks up the phone, punching a button to get a clear line. He dials.

HARVEY (cont'd) (into phone) Al? Harvey. Listen, what have you got for me? It doesn't matter what kind of scam it is, I just want to make a buck. But you've got to do better than last time. Now, what can you offer me? Uh huh. I see. A retired home massage parlor for people over eighty. Yeah, that's a possibility. What's this stuff you sent over? Uh huh ---

Harvey picks up a small disc attached to what appear to be teeth braces. Jimmy walks in, sits in the corner, and listens in on Harvey's conversation. HARVEY I see, it's an oral smoke alarm.

He fits it into his mouth, then removes it. He nods.

HARVEY (cont'd) -- For people who want to stop smoking. The alarm goes off in their mouth if they start to inhale? Yeah, count me in on that. What about this other thing, Al?

Harvey holds up a tiny vacuum cleaner about the size of a pen.

HARVEY (cont'd) -- Yeah, that's it. A personal hygiene vacuum cleaner? I gotcha. Cleans any hole in your body. vacuums out your nose, belly button, all of them. Yeah, maybe. What else? A do-it-yourself burial kit? Yeah, a black shovel, yeah, a casket out of vegetable crates? Uh huh. Freeze-dried embalming fluid. I'll think it over. Talk to you later, Al.

Harvey hangs up. Jimmy comes over to him.

JIMMY Dad, why are you always promoting these sleazy, crazy deals?

HARVEY For you, son. All for you.

Harvey leans back in his chair, looks at the ceiling with misty eyes.

HARVEY (cont'd) Maybe someday, I'll be the Parent Magazine Father of the Year. There's a one thousand dollar prize that goes with it.

Harvey stands and crosses to a mirror.

HARVEY (cont'd) Mirror, mirror, on the wall -- send me an Arab to buy this place.

ELLIOT (0.S.)

Hey, are you done with the phone? Harvey sneers at Elliot over his shoulder. There is a knock at the door.

ACE (O.S.)

Harvey?

HARVEY

I think so.

Ace walks in, sidestepping all the junk around him. Ace is not whom Harvey wants to see.

HARVEY (cont'd) Oh, hello Ace.

ACE Hi, Harvey, good buddy. What a night, huh?

HARVEY

(moans) Yeah.

ACE Can I speak to you privately?

They walk into the bathroom.

107 INT. - BATHROOM

The bathroom is packed with more of Elliot's things: live chickens, a blow-up vinyl woman, etc. Under the bathroom stall door, we see a chimp's legs dangling down with skates on the feet. Harvey looks at the legs.

HARVEY

Honey, is that you?

Harvey puts on his tuxedo jacket.

ACE I hear you're going to be judging the contest tonight.

HARVEY If I can wade through my own office, I will.

ACE Well, you know I'm entering. I think I'm the winner.

HARVEY I wish you the best.

We hear the chimp stall toilet flush. Harvey turns toward the stall.

HARVEY (cont'd) (to chimp) Clean up and I'll give you a banana.

Ace helps Harvey with his tie.

ACE

Yeah, I sure would be disappointed if by some stupid chance another contestant should happen to beat me because of a judge's error in judgment.

HARVEY Don't you worry. I'll judge this thing fair and square.

ACE Good, because I would hate to see this lovely place look like the sequel to "Towering Inferno."

Harvey suddenly acts tough.

HARVEY Ace, are you threatening me? ACE

Yes.

Harvey is meek again.

HARVEY That's what I thought.

Harvey looks at Ace. Ace adjusts Harvey's tie again. this time a little too tight.

HARVEY (cont'd) Were you ever with the Nixon Administration? This is just a contest. You get a trophy, a few bucks; it's kid's stuff.

Let's just say I'm still young at heart.

HARVEY (whispering) Headache.

There is a knock at the door.

JIMMY (O.S.)

Dad?

HARVEY

What?

JIMMY (O.S.) I've got to talk with you.

HARVEY (annoyed) Come in.

Jimmy comes in and spots Ace and motions to his father.

JIMMY

Dad, can we speak in private?

Harvey looks around and they both go into the shower. Harvey closes the door.

108 INT. - SHOWER

HARVEY

Now, what's so important that it can't wait a few minutes?

JIMMY

The Citizen's Committee is coming to see the office.

HARVEY

The Citizen's Committee? The old broad who's such a prude she's got a burglar alarm between her knees?

JIMMY

Yes, sir.

HARVEY

And her husband, who hasn't been sexually aroused since Germany invaded Poland?

JIMMY

Yes, sir.

HARVEY

HARVEY They're coming to this office?

JIMMY

Yes.

HARVEY

Tonight?

JIMMY

Any second.

Harvey feigns calmness.

HARVEY Doesn't bother me. (back to panic) Well, what are you standing there for? Go stall them, quick!

109 INT. - BATHROOM

They race out of the shower stall. Ace turns around and starts to talk.

ACE

Harvey ---

ACE You stay here. Don't come out. I'll be right back.

Harvey and Jimmy race out the bathroom door.

110 INT. - HARVEY'S OFFICE - NIGHT

Harvey runs around the office shooing the llamas into the bathroom. He tosses boxes in back of his desk. Elliot is still busy on the phones.

ELLIOT -- Two baseball gloves, a chemistry set, and some training bras, I don't know what size. They're for the llamas.

Elliot sits on Harvey's swivel chair with the phone on his lap. Harvey wheels Elliot, the chair, and the phone into a closet. Just then he spots the Citizen's Committee outside the window. Jimmy is trying to stall them. He takes one last look around the room as he straightens his jacket and calms himself down. Just then he spots a tall marijuana plant in a vase. The card on the plant says "HAPPY SMOKING." Harvey frantically runs around with the plant and finally shoves it

into a file cabinet and closes the drawer just as the Committee comes in. He sits on the cabinet and smiles.

HARVEY Good evening. Welcome to Skate Town U.S.A. I hope your visit with us is a pleasant one and all your needs and personal ---

The leader of the bunch, Mrs. Elvira McCormick, interrupts. She is backed by her husband and another woman.

ELVIRA Cut it, Mr. Ross. We all know why we're here so perhaps we could do without a speech.

Harvey pastes on a smile over an obvious sneer.

ELVIRA (cont'd) I believe you know my husband, Murray.

HARVEY

Yes, Murray. Didn't I lend you my raincoat in the Pussycat Theater? Just kidding.

ELVIRA

And this is Mrs. Thorndike.

They nod without smiling.

ELVIRA (cont'd) We represent the Society to Trounce out Ugly Filth and Fornication in our Youth -- S.T.U.F.F.Y.

THORNDIKE

S.T.U.F.F.Y is very concerned about your establishment, Mr. Ross.

HARVEY

Well, I assure you there is nothing to be concerned about. So, if we can retired to the lobby --- MURRAY

We have testimony to the contrary.

ELVIRA

There are a lot of strange things going on here. My knee was personally attacked on the way in.

Just then, the closet door opens and Elliot can be seen talking quietly in the closet.

MURRAY

We plan to get to the bottom of this.

THORNDIKE

Yes. According to our sources, this is a gay hangout with drugs, sex, booze, and prostitution.

Harvey nonchalantly walks over to the closet door and slams it shut. He turns and address the group with phony indignation.

HARVEY

What do you mean, booze? Mrs. Thorndike! I am appalled by your insinuations.

THORNDIKE You mean you deny them?

HARVEY No, I'm simply appalled.

Just then, the llamas start kicking the door to the bathroom. All eyes turn to Harvey.

HARVEY (cont'd) Construction. We're always improving the place. We're decorating the urinal.

ELVIRA

Well, Mr. Ross. We are here to inspect your establishment, and if it doesn't meet our community

(MORE)

ELVIRA (CONT'D) standards of ethics, I am sure the City Council will revoke your license.

HARVEY Go right ahead. Skate Town U.S.A. has nothing to hide.

He hits the top of the file cabinet for emphasis, and the drawer glides open. The leaves of a marijuana plant spring out of the top of the drawer. Harvey quickly conceals the plant, stuffing it back into the file cabinet.

> HARVEY (cont'd) Jimmy, escort these fine people around the place while I get ready for our contest.

> > JIMMY

Sure, Dad. Right this way, please.

Jimmy and the people from S.T.U.F.F.Y. leave. Harvey takes this brief time-out to sit on the desk, take a shot glass of liquor and begin to sip. Just then, the door to the bathroom crashes to the floor and the llamas gallop into the room. Ace follows them, talking to Harvey while Elliot leaves the closet speaking a mile a minute. Harvey looks up to the heavens.

HARVEY

Headache! Headache! Headache!

111 EXT. - SKATE TOWN - NIGHT

Stan is practicing his routine in the parking lot. Richie sits on the hood of a car watching the hookers lead the Disco Doctor.

STAN You know, Richie. I think I'm going to win this thing.

RICHIE

Well, maybe.

STAN (skating) Maybe? What happened to the ol' positive thinking?

RICHIE Winning isn't everything.

STAN But what about the girls? All those pretty girls flocking around you because you manage the champ?

RICHIE A lot of good it's going to do me in a wheel chair.

STAN Don't worry about Ace and those creeps. Where's your sense of challenge?

RICHIE

I left it back home with my sense of bravery and courage. Where's your sense of smarts? That's what I wanna know? Making eyes at the sister of Charlie Manson in there. Stan laughs and continues skating.

Richie hears some commotion to the side. He looks over.

112 EXT. - BAND BUS - RICHIE'S POV

Elliot leads a line of delivery men into the bus. The llamas enter, beautiful girls follow.

113 BACK TO STAN AND RICHIE

RICHIE Would you look at that? Come on. Let's go take a peek.

STAN Naw. I'm going to practice. Go ahead. 112

RICHIE

Be back.

Richie takes off. Stan continues circling the area. He does a few spins and then spots something. Allison stands right before him. Stan stops.

ALLISON

I just came out here to tell you to be careful, OK? Stan smiles and shakes his head, yes.

ALLISON

So be careful.

She starts to skate away. Stan skates after her.

STAN

Wait! Where are you going? I've been wanting to talk to you all night.

ALLISON (abruptly) I can't stay.

STAN

Wait!

She stops.

ALLISON

Listen. I have to get back. My parents grounded me and if Ace even suspected I was out here talking to you he'd tell them and I'd be locked in my house all summer. Anyway, what's the use? Can't you see we're star-crossed lovers? We're from different worlds: you're from the Valley and I'm from Santa Monica. It'll never work.

She skates away.

CONTINUED: (3)

STAN Sure it can work ---

Allison doesn't stop.

ALLISON I've just got to get back.

STAN (yelling) I meant what I said about winning for you.

Allison smiles to herself as she disappears into Skate Town.

114 ANOTHER ANGLE

Stan watches Allison as she skates away. determinately, he circles the parking area and tries a spin in the air. He loses his balance slightly as he comes down.

MAURICE (O.S.) Try taking off a little later.

Stan looks around. He doesn't spot anybody.

STAN Is someone talking to me?

MAURICE (O.S.) Yeah. You took off too soon. You didn't have time to recover.

Stan curiously circles around a van.

115 STAN'S POV - ON VAN AND MAURICE

The back double doors of the van are open and we can see a pair of legs sticking out from below. Finally, we see it is the old pro -- Maurice.

Stan is surprised. Maurice is just finishing a snack in the back of the van. He continues to talk.

MAURICE It's all in the timing. You got to get the right feel, the right rhythm. Here.

Now, a double.

Stan attempts a double twist. He can do it. He is amazed. They finish the routine with a handshake. Just then, Bobby Blue's voice comes through the outside speaker.

MAURICE (to Stan) That's my cue.

Maurice grabs some black garments from his van and rolls toward the entrance.

MAURICE You remember what I taught you. It's all in the attitude.

Maurice skates away. Stan watches him with a smile.

BOBBY BLUE Ladies and gentlemen, welcome the

A line of slow-moving people await root beer refills. Ben is dipping onto the root beer himself. He pours a cup, takes a sip from the top, pours some more in the cup, and gives it to the customer. Ben holds out his hand for the customer's change. The customer misses Ben's hand and it falls to the counter. Ben takes the invisible money in his hand and puts it into the cash register.

121 INT. - LOUNGE AREA - RIPPLE

Ripple takes a load of root beers on a tray and pogo sticks to a table nearby.

122 ANGLE ON S.T.U.F.F.Y. PEOPLE - AT TABLE

Ripple places the root beers around the table. They talk about religion and the deprivation of youth.

123 ANGLE ON DJ - PASSING BY IN A CART

He sprinkles some confetti on the S.T.U.F.F.Y. people.

BOBBY BLUE Have a good time, kiddies.

124 BACK TO SCENE

The S.T.U.F.F.Y. people dust off the confetti. They take a sip of their drinks. Harvey comes up and tries to sweet-talk them. It won't work.

125 INT. - RINK

The group finishes its routine. In the foreground, Eleanor skates through.

131 INT. - BANDSTAND

Harvey walks up to the microphone.

HARVEY That was the great Maurice Cook, ladies and gentlemen.

More applause.
